

Activity Instructions

Activity Name: Alliteration Activity

Study: Balls

Objective for Learning: 15b, 16a, 16b



The following supplies are needed for this activity:
Index Cards

Instructions:

The definition of alliteration is the use of words that begin with the same sound near one another (as in silly soccer socks or baseball bat)

Write one word on each index card. Write words that start with the same letter. Ask your child what the beginning letter is on the card. Then show another word that begins with the same letter on another card. Ask child to recognize letter and sound. Keep the words to 3 or 4 letters

Another great way to hear alliteration is by doing a tongue twister such as:

Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers,
A peck of pickled peppers Peter Piper picked;
If Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers,
Where's the peck of pickled peppers Peter Piper picked?

Once the skill is becoming mastered you and your child can write your own alliteration/tongue twister. Share your observations and tongue twister with your child's teacher.
