

## Activity Instructions

Activity Name: Singalong – Fruit Trees

Study: Trees

Objective for Learning: 8a, 8b, 9b, 20a



The following supplies are needed for this activity:

Fruit  
Crayons  
Markers  
Pencil

### Instructions:

- Have your child watch the video and join in.
- Talk to the child about what fruits they like to eat.
- Explain to your child that some fruits grown on trees, some grow on vines and some grow on bushes.
  - Fruits that grow on trees are pears, peaches, apples, lemons, bananas, cherries, oranges, limes, persimmons, plums, and coconuts
  - Fruits that grown on vines are watermelons, cantaloupes, honeydew melons and grapes
  - Fruits that grow on bushes are strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, and pineapples
- If you have some fruit at home look at it with your child and talk about the colors and textures of the fruit. This apple is red and smooth, and the pineapple is yellow and prickly.
- Let your child taste different fruit and label the taste the green apple is sour, but the red apple is sweet.
- Let your child color the fruit tree and practice writing Fruit Tree. See if they can identify the piece of fruit hanging on the tree (Pear).
- Cut out the pieces to the fruit matching game and play a round or two with your child.
- Share with your teacher the sample of your child's handwriting.
